Half Term Curriculum Overview

Year 5/6 Summer 1

English

- We follow The Write Stuff to support English teaching at the Regis Academy.
- The Write Stuff is based on two guiding principles; teaching sequences that slide between experience days and sentence stacking lessons. With modelling at the heart of them, the sentence stacking lessons are broken into bite-sized chunks and taught under the structural framework of The Writing Rainbow. Teachers prepare children for writing by modelling the ideas, grammar or techniques of writing.

Physical Education

History

- Children will study titanic and its significance in history.
- Will will explore the class sytems to help us understand the society during this time.
- Children will explore the course of the ship through map skills (longitude and latitude) and identify where the ship sunk.
- Understand safety advancement this disaster has on our lives today.



Mathematics

- Children will investigate statistics and properties of shape.
- Children in Year 6 will also complete their SATs in this half term.
- Following SATs, children will consolidate their learning.

RE

 Children will focus on temptation; they will look at how different religions view temptation, exploring their understanding of good and evil.

Art

 Children will design their own advertising posters for the Titanic. They will explore artists of the time and current art styles used for advertising.

Science

- Children will learn about light and how it travels.
- We will explore how the eye works to help us see light.

Computing

Blogging provides a worldwide audience for pupils' work. Commenting on others' work extends pupils' sense of membership of a learning community beyond school. In this unit, pupils create a media-rich blog, comment on blogs and respond to comments. This unit will enable the children to: become familiar with blogs as a medium and a genre of writing create a sequence of blog posts on a theme incorporate additional media comment on the posts of others develop a critical, reflective view of a range of media, including text.
