

West Bromwich Albion Vs Bristol City

Despite cloudy skies at the Hawthorns, a positive crowd and a confident team created a win.

In the early minutes of the game, it looked like Bristol may have taken the lead. Sykes took a chance at goal but scuffed his shot so Palmer could collect it. A few minutes later, Johnstone took a shot but sent it wide, then shortly after Conway had a one on one with Palmer, but the Baggies' keeper remained unbeaten.

In the 27th minute, Townsend, now back from injury, fouled McCrorie, which leads to a yellow card. 5 minutes later, Wallace makes a cross to the box, but no one was there to get the ball in the goal.

Then it was Albion's turn to apply pressure. Fellows made an excellent cross to Furlong, who took control and with barely any room to play got his shot away, but sadly it just missed the Bristol goal. Soon after, Albion captain Wallace had a low cross, but no-one was there to meet it. Finally, at the edge of half time, the pressure paid off, as Fellows had a perfect shot from just inside the 18-yard box and scored.

In the second half of the game, the Baggies started quickly, as Wallace had a cross come to him that he smashed into the back of the net. Bristol tried to respond with Gardner-Hickman taking a free kick, but it was well defended, and the resulting corner came to nothing. A few minutes later, Gardner-Hickman was given a yellow card for his foul on Mowatt. Albion started to push again, with Diangana stealing the ball off Bristol and making his way towards goal but this was well defended by Vyner, preventing a third goal.

In the 66th minute, there was another chance for Albion when Johnstone was fouled by Sykes, leading to a free kick. Mowatt has a chance at goal, but he slipped so he missed his shot. After that, Bristol had no luck because Albion just kept pushing for another goal and they were kept mostly in their own half.

Albion stayed strong to keep their clean sheet and the game ended 2-0, with the win keeping the baggies in 5th place. They look on now to their next match away at Millwall after the international break.
